2. Basis of preparation

(a) Statement of compliance

These interim financial statements have been prepared in accordance with international accounting standards (International Accounting Standards – IAS and International Financial Reporting Standards – IFRS), issued by International Accounting Standards Board (IASB), as adopted by the European Union.

Under IAS 34, these interim financial statements have been prepared in accordance with IAS 1.

The Company is considering the bond issue and for that reason these interim financial statements were prepared. The interim financial statements were prepared for the period from 27 September 2019 to 16 October 2019 in order to meet regulatory requirements connected with the bond issue.

The Board of Directors approved interim financial statements on 4 December 2019.

(b) Critical accounting estimates and assumptions

The financial statements have been prepared on a going-concern basis using the historical cost method.

(c) Functional and presentation currency

The Company's functional and presentation currency is Czech crown ("CZK").

(d) Use of estimates and judgments

The preparation of financial statements in accordance with International Financial Reporting Standards requires the use of certain critical accounting estimates that affect the reported amounts of assets, liabilities, income and expenses. It also requires management to exercise judgement in the process of applying the Company's accounting policies. The resulting accounting estimates will, by definition, seldom equal the related actual values.

(e) Standards issued but not yet effective and recently issued accounting standards

Standards issued but not yet effective and recently issued accounting standards are not expected to have any material impact on the Company' financial statements.

3. Significant accounting policies

(a) Cash and cash equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents comprise cash balances on hand and in banks, and short-term highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less.

(b) Non-derivative financial liabilities

The Company has the following non-derivative financial liabilities: trade and other payables. Such financial liabilities are initially recognised at nominal value.

The Company derecognises a financial liability when its contractual obligations are discharged, cancelled or expire.

We have audited the accompanying interim financial statements Heureka FinCo CZ a.s. ("the Company"), prepared in accordance with International Financial Reporting Standards as adopted by the European Union, which comprise the statement of financial position as at 16 October 2019, and the statement of comprehensive income, the statement of changes in equity and the cash flow statement for the period from 27 September 2019 to 16 October 2019, and notes to the interim financial statements, including a summary of significant accounting policies and other explanatory notes.

In our opinion, the accompanying interim financial statements give a true and fair view of the financial position of the Company as at 16 October 2016, and of its financial performance and its cash flows for the period from 27 September 2019 to 16 October 2019 in accordance with International Financial Reporting Standards as adopted by the European Union.

Basis for Opinion

Our opinion is not modified in respect of this matter.
